
Please prepare a lesson plan that reflects as much whole group instruction as possible. It is my job to provide the modifications. It is your responsibility to determine <u>what</u> is to be taught and to provide a general framework for how the lesson would normally be conducted. With that in mind, please <u>do not try to create the "world's best lesson plan."</u> If you do, you will create unnecessary work for yourself and you may experience resistance to the modifications that will be suggested.

<u>Nametags for students</u>: Please prepare name tags, (2.5"x3.5" adhesive type). Use a black magic marker to print the first name of each student in large bold print. Please bring the name tags to the planning session. We will code them during the planning session.

Grouping of students: Please sort your class into thirds, based on learning style. Then, **prior to my arrival**, create groups of 3 with one student from each learning style in each group. (See graphic)

Learning style 1. Students who need to <u>physically interact</u> with concepts in order to understand them. (Kinesthetic) Learning style 2. Students who tend to <u>understand what you say</u>, the first time you say it. (Linguistic) Learning style 3. Students who need to <u>see a model</u> in order for them to understand concepts. (Spatial)

General overview of our co-teaching lesson



- 1. You and I meet to discuss the upcoming lesson and teaming strategies. All other team members observe. (60 minutes)
- 2. You and I team teach the lesson in your classroom with your students. All other team members observe (45 to 90 minutes)
- 3. You and I meet with the other team members to discuss the effects of the teaming on student outcomes during the team teaching lesson. (30 to 45 minutes)
